- * Mission: Create opportunity for community, resources and recovery with our un-housed neighbors.
- * Opened in July, 2021 in response to the Jefferson County Heading Home Strategic Plan at 7011 W. Colfax
- Provide access to the following services: housing navigation, resource navigation, health care, social and emotional supports, government ID, food security resources, etc.
- * Drop-in center and medical respite/recuperative care



Homelessness is primarily an affordable housing challenge

- * Unprecedented increase in housing and living costs on the Front Range is making a challenging solution even more challenging
- * Creating strong, resilient and competitive neighborhoods and corridors depend on ensuring people have safe places to live, have access to livable wages, and can afford important things like child care, food and health care.
- * The cost of doing nothing far outweighs costs of programs, partnerships and system change to addressed the unhoused.



Creating and supporting solutions to a regional challenge

- RecoveryWorks (RW) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit working in collaboration with an ecosystem of providers with a unified goal - rehousing the unhoused.
- * We help to foster connections across and among providers by serving as a nexus point, convenor, and trusted resource.
- * RW provides a proven, tested, and client-driven approach that is datadriven and outcomes-focused.
- * Working with public, private and nonprofit partners to solidify a rehousing infrastructure in order to get and stay ahead of the growing unsheltered homelessness problem. (Navigation Center Model).
